Over 8,000 people nationwide and from all parts of Israeli society gathered in Latrun to mark the 76th Independence Day. This moving event was an initiative of dozens of organizations, including Hashomer Hachadash, who joined together in the Union of Unity and Hope. Together with bereaved families, families of hostages, wounded soldiers, and reservists, a rally of unity was held. ## HASHOMER HACHADASH VOLUNTEERS PLANT A VINEYARD IN THE GOLAN HEIGHTS FOR TULIP WINERY.

Due to rocket and drone strikes, the vinevard of Tulip Winery, located near the Lebanese border, was heavily damaged and became a closed military area, making it impossible to work, prune, or harvest, causing severe economic damage. Despite the significant losses, the winery owner decided not to give up and to plant a new vineyard in Natur, in the Golan Heights. Hashomer Hachadash volunteers arrived early in the morning to plant over 25 acres of vineyard. Roy Yitzhaki, the owner of Tulip Winery, said: "Seeing the pace of work here, the people working shoulder to shoulder planting anew-it's very moving, and it's a moment of relief amidst the complex situation we have been experiencing since October 7. I am very grateful and appreciative of the Hashomer Hachadash volunteers who came here."
